# REPORT ON STUDENTS ON CURRICULUM, TEACHING, LEARNING & EVALUATION ASPECTS

#### Feedback Report

The feedback exercise in respect of students on curriculum, teaching and evaluation aspects as per NAAC requirements was conducted from 17.05.2021 & 18.05.2021 to which 209 students responded.Out of 209 students, 155 respondents are from Arts Stream and 54 respondents are from Commerce Stream (Details annexed).

The reports were analysed by a team of 4 (four) members appointed for the purpose. Responses are analysed and simplified on percentage basis. Additional information wherever required has been highlighted using asterisk sign (\*).

From the survey, it was observed that the general response towards the questions asked was positive besides certain questions like Q.No.11, Q.No.14, etc. which needs to be looked into:

- Q. 11. Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to you
- Q. 14. Teachers are able to identify your weakness and help you overcome them

It was also observed from the suggestions of the respondents that internet connectivity is a major issue in the process of online classes. Adding to that, the efficient utilization of ICT tools is an urgent requirement.
