# 1. INTRODUCTION OF THE COLLEGE:

- The Dimapur Government College is now 51 years old.
- Assessed and accredited with B Grade under NAAC assessment
- Offers the following courses
- a) BA with Honours in 6 (six) subjects and another 10 (ten) subject at pass Course level
- b) B Com with Honours in 2 (two) papers and 18 (eighteen) papers at pass course level.
- c) Diploma in Hospitality and Tourism under the Community College Programme (Vocational).
- d) Certificate in Floriculture under RUSA Scheme (Vocational).

# 3. ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS:

# a. University end Semester Result (Semesters IV & VI):

- i) **4<sup>th</sup> Semester**: In Arts stream, out of 233 students, 223 students were promoted with an overall pass percentage of 95.70%. In Commerce stream, 77 students were promoted out of 82 students with a pass percentage of 93.90%.
- ii) **6<sup>th</sup> Semester**: In Arts stream, out of 252 students, 149 students passed in all subjects with a pass percentage of 59.12%. In Commerce stream, out of 59 students, 07 students passed in all subjects with 11.86 pass percentage.

# b. Results of Semester I, III & V:

- i) 1<sup>st</sup> Semester: Out of 294 regular students in Arts, 273 students have been promoted (92.85%).
- ii) Out of 88 regular students in Commerce, 82 students have been promoted (93.18%).
- **iii**) **3<sup>rd</sup> Semester:** Out of 258 regular students in Arts, 236 students have been promoted (91.47). Out of 88 regular students in Commerce, 83 students have been promoted (94.31%).

**5th Semester:** Out of 234 regular students in Arts, 228 students have been promoted (97.43%). Out of 82 regular students in Commerce, 81 students have been promoted (98.78%).

# c. Community College:

- i) August 2016 July 2017 Session: 15 students have been awarded Diploma Certificate and out of which 5 students were given industrial placements.
- ii) August 2017 July 2018 Session: 31 students have been enrolled in the current session.

# d. Floriculture (RUSA):

Since January 2017 two batches of students were trained for Certificate Course in Floriculture where 18 students and 30 students respectively. All the students of first batch completed the course successfully and received their Certificates And the latest batch of students will get their result in December '17.

The Course comprises of 3 components of 1+2=3 credits where both Practical and theory papers are taught.

As a part of the Course requirement the students were taken out for Field Trips to

- i. Niathu Gardens & Flora Vale Nursery to make the students observe and learn Nursery Management activities.
- ii. Kohima Cathedral and Kohima War Cemetery to study the landscaping and Flower maintenance techniques.
- iii. Zopar Exports Pvt. Ltd, Mizoram, famous for large scale Flower cultivation.

#### e. Publications:

The College has published successfully its Annual Academic Journal. This is a refereed journal containing 13 papers.

- **f. RCs/OCs/STCs**: All together 3 Teachers attended Refresher/Orientation/Short-Term Courses.
- **g. Seminars**: All together, 4 Inter-Departmental Seminars were held during the year.
- **h.** Establishment of an Archaic Section under the Supervision of History department has been initiated.
- **i.** Establishment of Psychology Laboratory started having spent Rs. 2 lakhs already to begin with.
- **j.** 2 Computer cubicles procured for 2 departments.
- **k.** Received 10 Computers, 10 Chairs, 10 Tables, 1 Printer and 1 Bus from Hon'ble CM, Dr. Shurhozelie Liezietsu.
  - N.B.: Regular on-going repair works are not highlighted.

# 4. PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

#### a. Constructions:

- i) Constructed one *kutcha* house for the *chowkidar* of girls hostel.
- ii) Constructed one footpath from auditorium approach Road to RUSA Floriculture greenhouse ( 260 metres).
- iii) Extended height of fencing along girls hostel.
- iv) Put up sound controlling materials on the walls of auditorium.
- v) Constructed work-shed as raw material store of RUSA floriculture.
- vi) 3 Rams and 1 Toilet for Differently-abled persons were constructed as a gift from the Directorate of Social Welfare, Government of Nagaland.

# vii) Ongoing constructions:

- a. Footbridge towards floriculture site.
- b. Permanent work-shed for floriculture.
- c. Administrative Block nearing completion under RUSA.
- d. Science Block under State Government funding
- e. A 100-bedded Boys Hostel under State Government funding
- f. A 20 KV Solar Power Plant funded by the Ministry for New and Renewable Energy (of both Centre & State).

# b. Tools, Machinery & Equipments Purchase:

- i) Purchased and installed a 100 KV transformer.
- ii) Purchased and installed 5 Nos. of Air Conditioner (AC).
- iii) 5 Laptops purchased, 5 Printers purchased, 1 Stabilizer purchased, 600 Nos. of chair purchased for Auditorium, 20 Desks & 20 Benches purchased.

# 5. IQAC ACHIEVEMENTS:

- ii) Initiated action for submission of Teaching Plan by every teacher at the beginning of the semester.

- iv) Invited Sociology and Psychology departments to formulate/develop their respective CBCP syllabi for necessary perusal with Nagaland University.

# 6. STUDENTS COCURRICULAR AND OTHER ACTIVITIES:

- i) Selected NCC cadets participated in 6 Special Camps and successfully completed the trainings.
- ii) NCC cadets organised Plantation and Beautification drive, Cleanliness Drive and also 30 cadets participated in the Swatch Bharat Abhiyan organised by DMC.
- iii) The Literati Club organised Debate and Workshop and also sent selected students to participate in various inter college competitions where several students won prizes.
- iv) The Remedial Committee successfully conducted remedial classes every Wednesday and achieved very encouraging results in backlog papers.
- v) The Disaster Management Committee selected various Response Teams such as Medical, Evacuation, Search, etc. and made arrangement for the selected students to attend trainings, meetings, etc. and also made arrangement of emergency equipments for ready use.
- vi) The DGCSC Advisory Committee and Election Committee successfully conducted election to the DGCSC for the tenure 2017-18 on Sept. 9, 2017.
- vii) NSS volunteers participated in Quiz Competition conducted by Nehru Yuva Kendra on 7<sup>th</sup> August, 2017.
- viii) NSS volunteers were sent to attend Youth Voter's Festival from 4 8 Sept. 2017.
- ix) Selected students were sent to compete in Debating organised by Nehru Yuva Kendra on 31<sup>st</sup> August, 2017 and took the 3<sup>rd</sup> Position.
- x) 10 Students and 1 Teacher were sent to participate in the training on "Life Skill, Leadership and Personality Development" conducted by Directorate of Youth resources from 31st Oct. to 2nd Nov. 2017.
- xi) Teachers and final Semester Honours students of four departments (Economics, Education, History and Commerce) undertook Study Tours to different locations.
- xii) The college team participated in the T20 Cricket Meet sponsored by Sewak Youth on 24 & 25 June.
- xiii) The monthly college sports activities have been held successfully to be culminated in the Annual College Sports Week in December.

# 7. LIBRARY

- a. The automation of the Library with Bar-coding was launched on 10<sup>th</sup> March, 2017.
- b. New digitized library cards were issued from March onwards.
- c. Books for the departments to the tune of Rs. 1,83,000/- were purchased.
- d. An MOU was signed between DGC and Unity College to facilitate library exchange where students of the two colleges can utilize the resources of each other's library.
- e. Renovation and carpeting of library was carried out.
- f. Arrangement for procuring one academic journal by each department this session.

# 8. BEST PRACTCES:

- i) Under Best Practice No. 1, the college received donations/contributions from teachers and granted scholarship to 16 economically weak students.
- ii) Under Best Practice No. 2, the IQAC arranged Teacher Exchange Programme under which 6 teachers went to Unity College and 5 teachers from Unity College came to DGC.
- iii) The on-going Student Welfare Fund through the financial contribution from teachers was enhanced to facilitate the increased number of 16 students from less privileged background. They are given a stipend of Rs. 500/- per month for the year 2017-18.
