




World Food Day observed on 16th October, 2023 by the Economics department, Dimapur Government College

The department of Economics in collaboration with North East Network (NEN) observed World Food Day under the theme, "Water is life, water is food. Leave no one behind" on 16th of October, 2023 at the Seminar Hall, DGC Campus from 1pm onwards.

The chairperson was Dr. Yelhi Vero, Asst. Professor, department of Economics, DGC and the speakers were Prof. Sanjay Sharma, Principal of Dimapur Government College and Wekoweu Tsuha, State Coordinator, NEN Nagaland.

The programme commenced with opening remarks and introduction by the chairperson, Dr. Yelhi Vero, followed by a welcome address by Anungla Aier, Associate Professor and Head of Department of Economics, DGC.

The Indigenous Food Recipe Competition was one of the highlights of the programme where students presented various indigenous dishes with their recipes and health benefits. Around 10 groups of students participated with a myriad of dishes from various indigenous tribes.

One of the speakers, WekoweuTsuha, spoke about the indigenous food systems and the gateways to various solutions to climate crisis. This was followed by a short film screening by the North East Network, Chizami under the tagline "Water Matters".

The speaker, Prof. Sanjay Sharma spoke on the theme of programme "Water is life, water is food. Leave no one behind" and gave a short briefing on the importance of conserving water and our food heritage.

The winners of the Indigenous Food Recipe Competition were announced and the first prize was awarded to Group No 5 which presented on Anishi Curry and Amsu as their indigenous dishes.

The second prize was awarded to group no 7 which presented Pongsen and Teang Hei Ak Maias their indigenous dishes.

The third prize was awarded to group no 4 which presented Penchung Han as their indigenous dish.

The programme ended with the vote of thanks by Pudezono Tase, Asst. Professor, department of Economics, DGC.

World Food Day, 2023

Concept Note:

The Food and Agriculture Organization of the UN (FAO) designated 16 October as World Food Day in 1979. World Food Day takes place annually and promotes awareness of hunger and action for the future of food, people, and the planet. Collective action across 150 countries worldwide, hundreds of events and outreach activities bring together governments, businesses, civil society organizations (CSOs), the media, the public, including youth.

Today, 2.4 billion people live in water-stressed countries, India being one of them. Many are smallholder farmers who already struggle to meet their daily needs, particularly women, Indigenous peoples, migrants, and refugees. World Food Day 2023 will focus on the theme, 'Water is Life, Water is Food. Leave No One Behind'. The theme aims to highlight the critical role of water for life on earth and water as the foundation of our food. It also seeks to raise global awareness about the importance of managing water wisely as rapid population growth, economic development, urbanization, and climate change threaten water availability. World Food Day 2023 looks at solutions to produce more food and other essential agricultural commodities with less water, while ensuring water is distributed equally, our aquatic food systems are protected, and nobody is left behind.

World Food day 2023 encourages the world to:

- Follow water friendly diets by choosing in-season fruits and vegetables, cereals such as pulses, millets and nuts because they usually require less water to produce.
- Eat more fresh foods because they are generally healthier and require less water to produce than ultra-processed foods and beverages.
- It takes a lot of water to produce food and to get it from farm to table. Lost and wasted food also means wasted water. Improve meal planning, buying only what you need, reuse leftovers in a new recipe or composting waste scraps to reduce your food waste.

To build a food and water secure world, it require a concerted efforts of diverse stakeholders including Governments, private sectors, academia, civil society, communities and individuals.

Joining the global action, North East Network in collaboration with Department of Economics, Dimapur Government College (DGC) will organise a World Food Day event at the DGC campus on 16th October. The event is organised with the objectives:

- 1. Initiate conversations on climate change, water and food crisis
- Create awareness on the significance of Indigenous food systems and knowledge
 The programme will be marked by talks, interaction, exhibition of posters, film screening, and indigenous food recipe competition by students of department of Economics.
