ANNUAL CONSOLIDATED REPORT FOR THE PERIOD 1st June 2024 to 31st May 2025.

1. Department employability internship presentation: The department of Economics successfully conducted employability research program on 12-9-2024. A total of 35 students gave their power point presentation. 5 teachers from the department asses their presentations.



2. Department of Economics meeting with North East Network (NEN) on 13-9-2024. HOD, Ms. Anungla Aier, express to NEN representatives her appreciation, benefits, privileges, advantages the department in particular and the college as a whole is getting from the MOU between NEN and Economics department. The department acknowledge NEN in accommodating 35 students for internship program in July 2024. The department highlighted the need for internship program under NEP 2020 and express gratitude to NEN for aiding the department. The department requested NEN for an extension of partnership for another 2 years.



3. Career Awareness in RBI 3rd Oct. 2024: Teachers of economics with BA 5th Semester Honors students attended a seminar on 3rd Oct 2024. The objective of the program is to generate greater awareness about career prospect offered by the RBI and to showcase the slew of facilities available with the RBI. 3 teachers along with students attended the seminar.



4. World food day: 16-10-24. World food day was organized by Economics club in collaboration with NEN on 16-10-24 at 12 noon under the theme "Right to Food for a Better life and a Better future." The program was chaired by Miss Tunatoli Kappo. President Economics club. The highlights of the program was a welcome address from HOD, Ms. Anungla Aier, followed by power point presentation on the theme by Miss Tatongsola and Miss Chiliam. To commemorate the day lunch was served.



5. 2nd Nagaland Economic conference cum National Seminar held on 25th October 2024: The National Seminar was organized by the department of Economics, Dimapur Government College, Dimapur in collaboration with Nagaland Economic Association, sponsored by ICSSR-NERC, Shillong and supported by Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), Dimapur Government College.

Prof. B. Panda, Director, ICSSR-NERC Shillong addressed the Seminar as Chief Guest. He shared his optimism that the region will be a resource based region for the growth of the country and towards developed nation. Prof. T. Zarenthung Ezung, Professor. Department of Economics, Nagaland University gave the keynote address. Prof. Sanjay Sharma, Principal, Dimapur Government College delivered the welcome address.

The seminar had a technical session in six different halls simultaneously including three technical sessions conducted online. A total of 33 research papers were presented in the seminar. Mr. Neidilhou Keditsu, Director, Department of Economics and Statistics, Government of Nagaland as Guest of Honor for the Valedictory session. The Valedictory session was followed by Nagaland Economic Association Conference meeting.



6. Eco Fest was organized on 10-11-24 under the theme, “Unleash your potential”, where the fest successfully bring together students from different classes and department to compete with each other in various competition. The fest had two sessions: a) Singing, extempore, debate and mimicry. Session b) Futsal, volleyball. A total of 165 students participated.



7. Research Internship assessment was conducted on 2-12-2024. A total of 10 research students along with the faculty of Economics department participated.



8. Departmental Seminar on 8-2-2025: Monthly research seminar was conducted by Department of Economics (sponsored by IQAC) on 15-2-25 at 12 noon in the Seminar Hall, DGC. The programme was chaired by Dr Yelhi Vero, Asst. Professor, Department of Economics, DGC. A paper on the topic "Pull Factors of Urbanisation in Nagaland. An Analysis of Dimapur District" was presented by Ms. Imtikokla Ozukum, Assoc. Professor, Department of Economics, DGC & Research Scholar, St. Joseph University, Chümoukedima, Nagaland. Dr. I. Moakala Jamir, Assoc. Prof. Department of economics pronounced the vote of thanks.



9. 16th NEN bio-diversity festivals:

The Economics Department of Dimapur Government College attended the second day of the 15th NEN Biodiversity festival on 7th march with 4 teaching faculty and 7 students with the objective to immerse oneself in learning about the importance of various species while also engaging in meaningful networking with experts and like-minded conservation enthusiasts. The overarching objective was to emerge more informed, connected and motivated to contribute positively to biodiversity conservation.

The 16th edition of the NEN biodiversity festival was held on 6-7th march 2025 at Chizami, with the theme "Nurturing Health, Wellbeing and Resilience: Sustaining our future together." It was organized by the North East network (NEN) which is a women's rights organization. It was founded by

Dr. Monisha Behal who is also the chairperson of NEN. This festival aimed to celebrate and raise awareness about the variety of life on earth including birds, animals, plants, insects and microorganism as well as the ecosystems they inhabit. It seek to educate the public about the importance of conservation, highlight the threats to biodiversity and encourage actions that support sustainable living and biodiversity conservation.

The main highlight of the event included the biodiversity exhibition and farmers market. The exhibition stalls showcased photography by photographer and conservationist from Green Hub, Natural fiber and traditional dyes by NEN enterprise- Chizami weaves, Chizami community seed bank, Medical plants curated by NEN and uncultivated edible plants by Enhulumi community knowledge holder, traditional potter from Runguzu Nasa and exhibition of poster by Chizami students. The farmers market participants consisted of the SEWA Dukaan, Kohima, Dzudu- Honey, Khutsami village, SEWA Shamator, Phor millet sisters, Local women entrepreneurs from Chizami, Phughi bamboo youth collective, Pathso youth collective- Bamboo and natural fiber, Li Cheh Kro and Chizami weaves.

The second day of the festival i.e., 7th March was attended by 202 diverse stakeholders including farmers, community leaders, women and youth from 23 villages from 6 districts of Nagaland, community- based organizations, government representatives from Department of Agriculture, KVK Porba, NGOs- FES, NCCAF, High land institute, Pabhoi Greens, Wildlife Conservation Society (WCS) Nagaland and DIET-Pfutsero.

The program consisted of various speakers who illuminated and addressed the importance of bio-cultural diversity conservation and the responsibility that each individual has in conserving the biodiversity. Sir Supongnuukshi Ao, IFS, Chief Conservator of Forest, Department of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Nagaland and Member Secretary, Nagaland State Biodiversity Board. He remarked “The value of biodiversity can be understood through the lens of the relationship we form and strive for with each other in the rest of nature. These relational values are part of people’s individual or collective sense of wellbeing, responsibility for and connection with the environment.” “Food security can be preserved only if we conserve our biodiversity.” The other important highlights was “Tour of Earth Market and Biodiversity Exhibition Stalls and the release of Chizami Biodiversity Booklet- BMC Chizami. Solidarity messages was given by Shangnaider, WSDC, Manipur and Rhondeni Kikon, The ANT, Assam.




10. Cleanliness Drive


